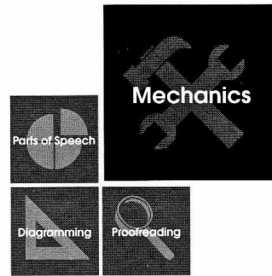

# Creating Adverbs

Often adjectives can be changed to adverbs by adding **ly**. If the adjective ends in **y** preceded by a consonant, change the **y** to **i** and add **ly**.

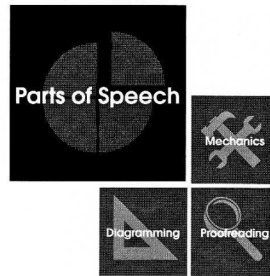

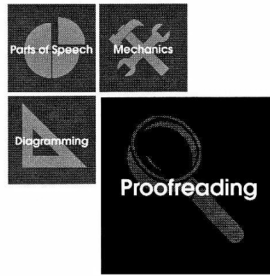
