Understand the Structure



Sentence diagrams show the structure of a sentence.

The subject of a sentence is placed on a horizontal line. The verb follows and is separated from the subject by a vertical line.

Articles (the, a, an) are placed on a diagonal line below the word they modify.

Frogs | croak



Careless Mistakes Can Cause Big Problems!



Nouns can be **singular** (cat) or **plural** (cats).

Verbs are also either singular (A cat **runs**), or plural (Cats **run**). A singular subject must **agree** with a singular verb.
